Recognize What's Recyclable

When you place electronics or items that have bulbs or batteries in them in the recycling cart, they contaminate the recycling stream. Throwing electronics out in the trash can harm the environment, cause fires and create other damage. Electronics, bulbs and batteries must be handled in a special way. The following can be recycled, though not in your curbside recycling cart.
